ScreenCast-O-Matic is a **free** program used to create **video screen captures with narration** (or “screencasts”) on your home or office computer. You can create and post videos on YouTube or on the company’s website. This program is compatible with both PCs and Macs.

ScreenCast-O-Matic: www.screencast-o-matic.com

- No software installation is required
- Can export videos to Quicktime (MP4), Windows Media Player (AVI) or Flash (FLV), post on YouTube or post to ScreenCast-O-Matic
- Can record a video in full motion
- Can show mouse cursor, mouse clicks and halo around the mouse
- Can record webcam

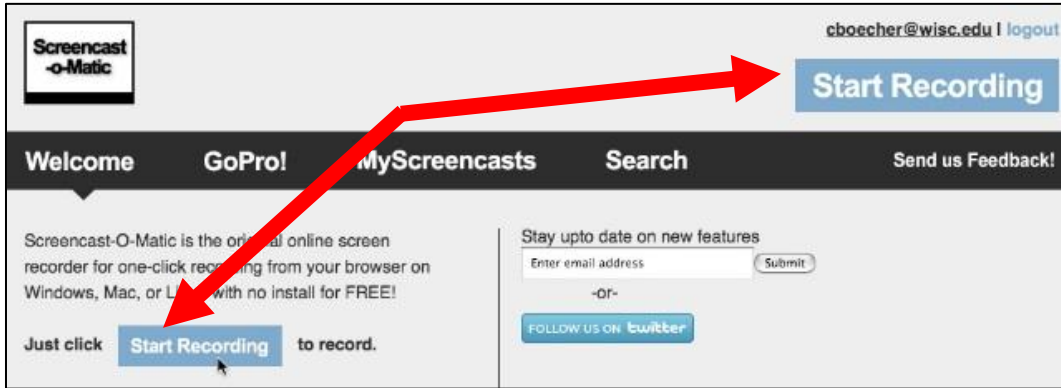
Create a ScreenCast with ScreenCast-o-Matic

Instructions for Recording

1. Go to www.screencast-o-matic.com. Click the “Login” link in the upper right corner. If you do not have an account, enter your information in the “Register” fields.



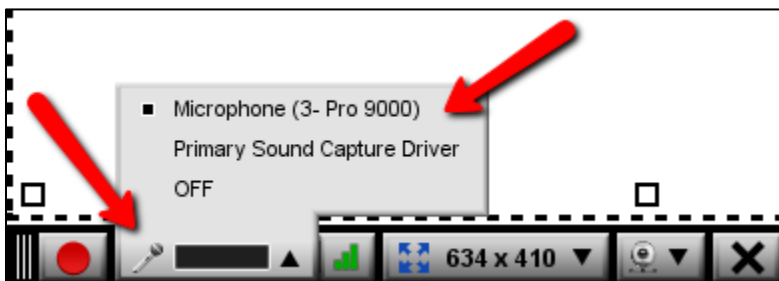
2. Once you are logged in, click the “Start Recording” in the upper right corner or left column.



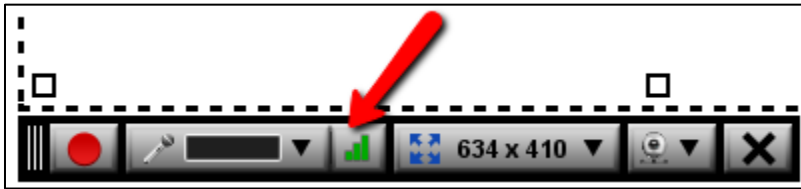
3. A frame will appear on your screen. This frame shows the recording area. Open up the application you would like to record (web page, Word document, etc.). Resize and relocate the frame around the desired recording area. (Tip: You may need to shrink down your application to a smaller size.)



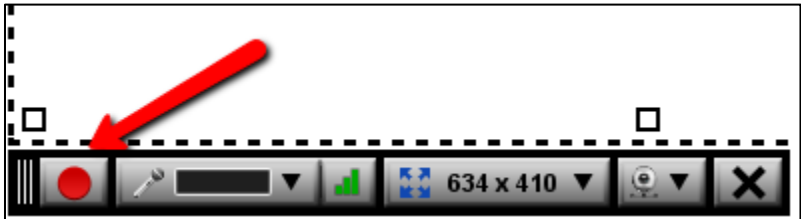
4. Click the microphone icon and click the correct microphone from the list, if more than one microphone is listed.



5. Check your microphone volume level.



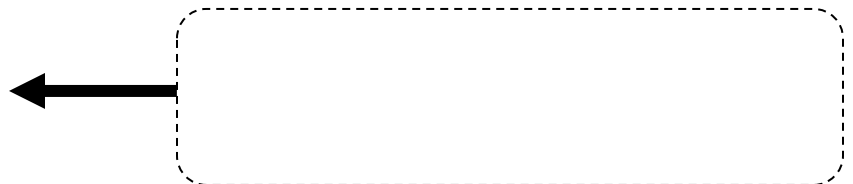
6. When you are ready to begin recording, click the circular red “record” button on the top left corner of the frame.



7. When the countdown from three is done, your recording will start. While recording, you have the option to pause with the blue “pause” button in the top left corner.
8. When you are finished recording, click the **Done** button on top of the frame.
9. Preview your video. *If you want to delete without saving*, click “Done with this Screencast” and start again. If you are content, click “Upload to SOM.”

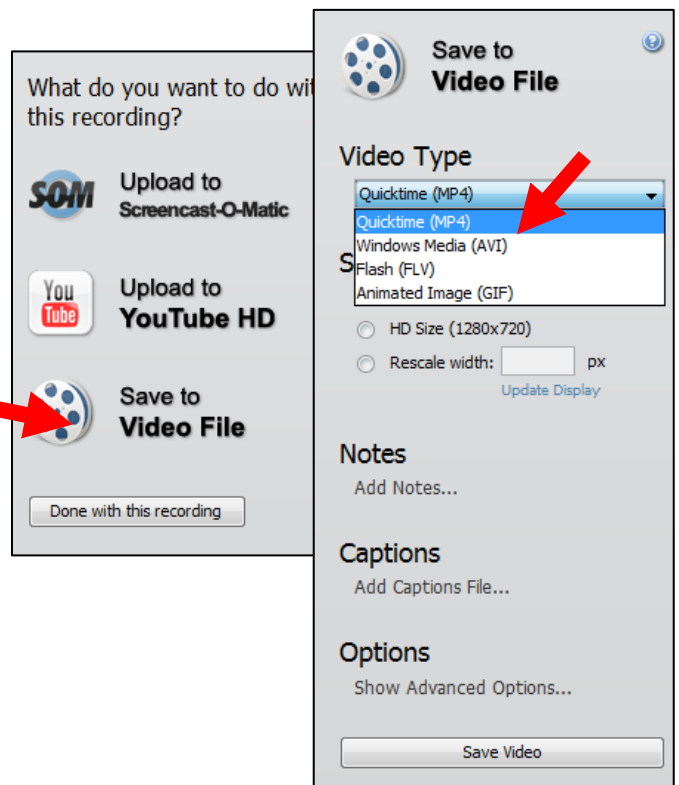
Save Your Screencast

You can save your screencast as a standalone file.



Save Video File

1. From the **Preview** screen, click **Save to Video File**
2. Under Video Type, choose either:
 - Quicktime (MP4)
 - Windows Media (AVI)
3. Click **Save Video**
4. Browse to a location you would like to save your video, name your file and click **Save**
5. Click **Back** to return to the **Preview** screen



Upload Your Screencast

You can upload your screencast to YouTube or your Screencast-O-Matic account and then link or embed your video.

Upload your Video File to screencastomatic.com

1. From the **Preview** screen, click **Upload to Screencast-O-Matic**
2. Give your screencast a title, description, and select the appropriate language. Adjust any other options, then click **Upload to SOM**
3. On the **Upload Complete!** page, copy and test the link to your screencast.
